Teaching languages English, French

Programme objectives Throughout the programme students acquire basic knowledge in key areas of physics and become familiar with many mathematical tools. By the end of the programme participants have acquired a broad view of physics, with additional training in the areas of chemistry and computer science. Duration	6 semesters / 180 ECTS
Teaching languages	French, English
