EU	The common Cultures Européennes (EU) is subdivided into thematic modules addressing different aspects of European cultures. Which EU modules you choose primarily depends on your preferences, but to complete your studies, you will need to validate 5 EU modules altogether. 1-2 EU modules can be required by the study programme. Module EU1 is mandatory for all BCE specialisation tracks. EU Modules are validated once you reach 12 ECTS. Transversal courses can be used to replace standard courses in EU modules. Please note that some transversal courses, such as interdisciplinary seminars, require more work and are therefore awarded more ECTS. They can thus be used to replace two standard courses in modules EU1-4 (8 ECTS) and EU5-8 (6 ECTS). The combination of EU modules you choose will affect the number of courses you are required to pass in order to complete your common curriculum. 12 ECTS (equivalent to 1 EU Module) can be validated using Mobility credits.
